

## BIO

Born in Madrid (1964) to an American mother and Spanish father, Daniel Canogar's life and career have bridged between Spain and the U.S. Photography was his earliest medium of choice, receiving a M.A. from NYU at the International Center of photography in 1990. He soon became interested in the possibilities of the projected image and installation art.

He has created permanent public art installations with LED screens, including *Phloem KfW* at the KfW Bankengruppe Headquarters (Frankfurt, 2024); *Latidos*, at the new Farmaconsulting Headquarters (Vitoria, 2024); *Shimmer* at the GEMÜ Headquarters (Kupferzell, 2024); *Pulsation*, the first-ever outdoor digital artwork, created specifically for the Serena Williams Building at Nike's World Headquarters (Oregon, 2023); *Brushstrokes*, a permanent LED screen artwork for the new DeKa Bank headquarters' lobby (Frankfurt, 2022); *Dynamo*, a site-specific audiovisual project designed for the Spain Pavilion in Expo Dubai 2020 (Dubai, 2021); *Currents*, a suspended artwork in the atrium of the renovated Evangelische Bank (Kassel, 2020); *Aqueous*, at The Sobrato Organization (Mountain View, CA, 2019); *Pulse*, at the Zachry Engineering Education Complex in Texas A&M University (College Station, TX, 2018); *Cannula*, *Xylem* and *Gust II* at the BB VA Bank Headquarters (Madrid, 2018) and *Tendrill*, at Tampa International Airport (Tampa, FL, 2017).

He has also created public monumental artworks in different media such as *Maelstrom San Fernando* (Madrid, 2024) and *Scrawl* (Madrid, 2023), generative artworks projected on San Fernando Royal Academy of Fine Arts and Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía façades; *Oculus*, a generative animation featured on Novartis Pavillon zero-media façade (Basel, Switzerland, 2022); *Bifurcation*, a multi-laser projection at Noor Riyadh Light & Art Festival (Riyadh, 2021); *Amalgama Phillips* (Washington DC, 2021) and *Amalgama El Prado* (Madrid, 2019), generative videos projected on the façades of the Phillips Collection and the Museo Nacional del Prado, created with the painting collections of both institutions; *Fulgurations*, a project in collaboration with the Spanish National Cancer Research Center (CNIO) (Madrid, 2021); *Constellations*, the largest photo-mosaic in Europe created for two pedestrian bridges over the Manzanares River, in Madrid Rio Park (Madrid, 2010) and *Asalto*, a series of video projections presented on various emblematic monuments, including the Arcos de Lapa (Rio de Janeiro, 2009), the Puerta de Alcalá (Madrid, 2009) and the church of San Pietro in Montorio (Rome, 2009). Also part of the series is *Storming Times Square*, screened on forty-seven of the LED billboards in Times Square (New York, NY, 2014).

His solo shows include "At Any Given Hour" at Galerie Anita Beckers (Frankfurt, 2024); "Vestigios" at Galería Juan Silió (Santander, 2023); "Pixelweaver" at bitforms Gallery (New York, 2023); "Loose Threads" at Galloire (Dubai, 2023); "Turbulencias" at Galería Max Estrella (Madrid, 2022); "Hidden Tides" at Wilde Gallery (Basel, 2021); "Amalgama Phillips" at The Phillips Collection (Washington DC, 2021); "Reverberations" at Kornfeld Gallery (Berlin, 2021); "Latencies" at Galerie Anita Beckers Gallery (Frankfurt, 2021); "Billow" at bitforms gallery (New York, NY, 2020); "Liquid Memories" at Sala Kubo-Kutxa (San Sebastian, 2019); "Surge" a temporary installation for the Grand Lobby Wall at Moss Arts Center, Virginia Tech (Blacksburg, VA, 2019); "Echo" at Paul and Lulu Hilliard University Art Museum (Lafayette, LA, 2019); "Melting the Solids" at Wilde Gallery (Geneva, 2018); "Fluctuations" at Sala Alcalá 31 (Madrid, 2017); "Echo" at bitforms gallery (New York, NY, 2017) and Galería Max Estrella (Madrid, 2017); "Sikka Ingentium" at Museum Universidad de Navarra (Pamplona, Spain, 2017); "Cuadratura" at Espacio Fundación Telefónica (Lima, 2014); "Vórtices" at the Fundación Canal Isabel II (Madrid, 2011); two installations at the Sundance Film Festival (Park City, UT, 2011) and "Synaptic Passage", an installation commissioned for the exhibition "Brain: The Inside Story" at the American Museum of Natural History (New York, NY, 2010).

He has exhibited extensively in major museums and galleries across the world, including LACMA Los Angeles County Museum of Art, L.A.; Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía, Madrid; Palacio de Velázquez, Madrid; The Phillips Collection, Washington DC; ZKM Center for Art and Media, Karlsruhe; Max Estrella Gallery, Madrid; bitforms gallery, New York, NY; Wilde Gallery, Geneva and Basel; Galerie Anita Beckers, Frankfurt; Eduardo Secci Contemporary, Florence; Kornfeld Gallery, Berlin; Santa Mónica Art Center, Barcelona; Alejandro Otero Museum, Caracas; Wexner Center for the Arts, Columbus OH; Offenes Kulturhaus Center for Contemporary Art, Linz; Kunstsammlung Nordrhein Westfalen, Düsseldorf; Hamburger Bahnhof Museum, Berlin; Borusan Contemporary Museum, Istanbul; American Museum of Natural History, New York, NY; Andy Warhol Museum, Pittsburgh, PA and Art Vault at the Carl & Marilyn Thoma Foundation, Santa Fe, NM. His artworks are part of the collections of renowned museums such as the LACMA (Los Angeles County Museum of Art), L.A.; Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía, Madrid; and the Whitney Museum of American Art, N.Y.C.

Daniel Canogar is an associate professor since 2010 of IE University's Architecture Program in Madrid. His "Experimentation Workshop" explores the intersection of architecture, technology and artistic innovation. He also teaches at the University of Navarra's Curatorial Studies Program in Pamplona, Spain. In 2024, he became a permanent Academic Member of the San Fernando Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Madrid, Spain.
